

## Determining Behavioral Health – Home- and Community-Based Services (BH-HCBS) Eligibility Residential Settings

Eligible BH-HCBS Settings:	Ineligible BH-HCBS Settings:
Are integrated and support access to the greater community (opportunities to work)	Are publicly or privately owned facilities that provide inpatient treatment
Ensure autonomy and independence: privacy, personal resources control, dignity, freedom from restraint	<ul> <li>Are on the grounds of, or immediately adjacent to, a public institution (e.g., hospital, prison)</li> <li>Isolate/separate individuals receiving Medicaid-funded services from the broader community of individuals not receiving Medicaid-funded services</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>restraint</li> <li>Ensure the individual receives services in the community to the same degree of access as individuals not receiving Medicaid home- and community-based services.</li> </ul>	
Examples of compliant settings:	Examples of noncompliant settings:
Member's own home	Nursing facility
Family home	Institution for mental illness
Emergency shelter	Hospital
	Intermediate care facility for IDD

If a member answers YES to ANY of these questions, the setting is eligible; authorize BH-HCBS.

- □ Do you own your apartment?
- $\hfill\square$  Do you live with other family in a private home?
- □ Do you primarily rely on emergency housing shelter?
- □ Do you use a section 8 voucher?

If a member answered NO to all of the above questions, proceed to the next box.

If a member answers YES to ANY of these questions, the setting is **ineligible** for BH-HCBS. Outreach to Care Manager for alternative services that best suit the member's needs.

- □ Does your residence schedule three meals for all residents?
- □ Is there 24-hour medical staff at your residence?
- □ Do you have 40 hours per week of structured treatment programming?
- □ Does every resident have support with medication management in the residence?
- □ Does every resident in the building have a disability?
- □ Is the residence located on the grounds of or near a hospital, prison, or other public institution?
- □ Did a court order place you in your current residence?

If a member answered NO to ALL of the above questions, in both boxes, the member likely resides in an OMH under-review setting. Review "Descriptions: BH-HCBS Residential Settings" to confirm.
